All Things That God Had Done Malawi Trip Reaps Great Harvest

Acts 14:27 says, "when they had arrived and gathered the church together, they began to report all things that God had done with them and how He had opened a door of faith" they had taken the gospel to the Gentiles. One of the greatest joys is sharing with the churches about the mission trip to Malawi. There have been opportunities to share directly and to say thank you to the WOBA churches because of their significant role in the support and ministry in Malawi.

Lonnie Hoelscher—Pastor, New Harmony Baptist, Rosemanne Park, Tammy Ivey, and Johnathan Long—Pastor, Lenapah Baptist, had the privilege of going to Malawi this past May/June. The plan was to teach and train 100 church members/leaders from 15 different churches the "Four Fields Ministry" model. The Lord provided nearly twice that number of people. As a result of the training and showing the Jesus Film two different times, more than 300 new professions of faith were recorded and 150 new believers were baptized. Psalms 37:23 says, "The steps of a man are established by the LORD; And He delights in his way." It is exciting to see the Malawians "go and bear much fruit" as a result of the teaching and modeling they received.

There is a hungering for the word of God among the Malawians, a door of faith has been opened by the Lord. At the same time it is heart-wrenching to know these new believers are facing a severe time of physical hunger. Due to difficult weather situations and a lack of available fertilizer, many will be running out of maize (the main food staple) by January and February. Because of this the Washington/Osage Baptist Association Churches need to join together in helping purchase maize (corn) to be used in Kalulu and Chifunga areas. This will help meet the needs of our sister churches in Malawi during the months of January, February and March of 2024. By acting now, one truckload of maize can be purchased for about \$2500 and will feed an entire village for a month. The goal is to purchase four truckloads of corn in September, before the price increase. This will provide a load in Kalulu and a load in Chifunga, both in February and March.

It is a great blessing to see the work of the Lord among the churches reaching their neighbors with the Gospel. Now the hope is the Washington/Osage Baptist Association churches will also be blessed to see them encouraged through helping meet this pressing need. All these things God has done and is doing!
