

Mission Opportunities:

Your association is committed to advancing the Gospel. When evaluating our budget, the Leadership Team and Executive Board is careful to make sure the funds contributed are focused on that commitment. Beyond caring for our buildings and property, the leadership of the association constantly evaluates each mission opportunity on its ability to further the Kingdom. Let me share some of the opportunities the association is currently a part of.

Local Mission Partners:

Pawhuska Ministerial Alliance assists people in Osage county with food and necessities.

The Cottage is a local ministry that assists women with crisis pregnancy providing group housing where they become involved in-home living skills and Bible studies.

Hope Clinic started by WOBA several years ago, offers free health care and prescriptions to those in need. Each patient is personally spoken to concerning their relationship with Christ during their appointment.

Disaster Relief ministers locally and nationally every time there is a natural disaster or a need. We have one of the best equipped teams in the state. Our Disaster Relief building is located near First Baptist Church, Bartlesville. It houses the equipment that is used to help those in need. Each time the team goes out the Gospel is shared with the person or persons in need.

National Partner:

We recently assisted a **new church plant in Windsor, Colorado**. This partnership will hopefully develop this coming year. More news to come!

International Partner:

This year we celebrate the 25th year of partnership with the **Baptists of Malawi**. Over 100 churches have been planted by the teams that have ministered in this very poor country. Thousands have been saved and continue to grow in Christ. We have established feeding centers with farms to grow the food needed to feed widows and orphans. So much has been done, it's hard to list them all.

I went on one of the first mission trips to Malawi back in 1998. When we arrived, it was evident that the pastors were waiting for us to show up so that we could establish the churches in the area. In the last few years, that has changed. The pastors that the association has assisted all these years are now out doing what we have trained them to do. The feeding centers are no longer in need of our funds, and the churches have taken leadership in advancing the Gospel. Because of this, we have established a **Pastoral Leadership Fund** to help the pastors in their efforts. **Instead of bringing them fish, we have taught them to fish**. Now we can come alongside them as they advance the Gospel.

You get to be a part of all this as your church generously contributes to Washington/Osage Baptist Association. Many more things are ahead as the Lord leads us.






